Learning to Cook

I learned long ago cooking is not an exact science. It is messy and somewhat unpredictable. Most of the time it is edible, sometimes it is even good, but it never looks like the picture in the book. Often I follow a recipe, which goes great right up to when it doesn't. Recipes are fine, but inevitably I'm missing an ingredient, my oven isn't accurate, or my pan sticks. There's always some unpredictable element.

Sometimes we treat the Bible like a recipe book. If we just follow the steps, 1, 2, 3, we will end up with a beautiful soufflé, or blessing, or salvation, or whatever. But the truth is that the recipe is just the starting point. It is there to get us moving in the right direction. Inevitably, we will encounter things that don't quite seem to work. We follow all the steps and end up, not with a fluffy soufflé, but a flat, sticky mess.

A good cook knows that one always has to adjust a recipe for one's own kitchen, ingredients, and local conditions. One always has to "season to taste."

The Bible was written a long time ago, in a place far, far away. The "kitchen" back then didn't look much like ours now. The recipe has to be adjusted for today. Thankfully, we are not left to

just guess. The cook who wrote the recipe is still in the kitchen with us offering suggestions: try a little more salt; add a bit more water If the recipe turns out well, it will not be because we followed the directions so well but because we continue to listen to the master chef cooking with us, the one who wrote the book, the one who has promised to remain with us until the table is finally set and the feast is ready. *Bon Appetit!*


