Easter Upset

"If the world is sane, then Jesus is mad as a hatter and the Last Supper is the Mad Tea Party. The world says, Mind your own business, and Jesus says, There is no such thing as your own business. The world says, Follow the wisest course and be a success, and Jesus says, Follow me and be crucified. The world says, Drive carefully—the life you save may be your own—and Jesus says, Whoever would save his life will lose it, and whoever loses his life for my sake will find it. The world says, Law and order, and Jesus says, Love. The world says, Get and Jesus says, Give. In terms of the world's sanity, Jesus is crazy as a coot, and anybody who thinks he can follow him without being a little crazy too is laboring less under a cross than under a delusion."

As I have stated before, I am not above letting someone else do the talking if they can say it better than me, and writer/theologian Fredrich Buechner has ALWAYS been able to see and say it better than me. As we hurtle toward Pentecost and the end of the Easter season, it is a good time to reflect on what we have been through together.

The resurrection turned everything upside down. The dead we had tucked into their graves fell out again. The stone we had rolled and sealed unrolled and unsealed. The sentence of death pronounced in our best binding words has been overturned by a higher court. We are forced to admit that we don't know what in the world is going on. Those condemned to the deepest

pits of hell have bounced back up again and now, in a parody of Palm Sunday, enter into the New Jerusalem riding contented donkeys while just one person – the one who led them there – stands by waving an unwounded palm and singing "Blessed are you who come in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest!"

Easter changes everything. If it hasn't changed us, then we still just don't get it. Jesus asks his followers to lead upside-down lives. It is contrary to common sense and everything else we thought we understood; everything except the Kingdom of God which is itself upside-down, undoing and reforming everything around and within us.

It is a strange new Easter world, and like Adam before us, we rise from the new creative clay with a comical look of befuddlement on our faces and think, *Well, this is interesting!*


