# Unapproved St. Paul's Ev. Lutheran Church Congregation Council Minutes for August 26, 2024

Present: Pastor Martin, Jerry Young, Greta Blegvad, Jim Rengert, Mary Billy, Sally Finck, Kerrill Foster, John Grangaard, Jerry DePalmo. Absent: Sadie Smith Jerry Young opened the meeting with prayer.

Motion to approve the July minutes was made by Jerry D and seconded by Mary B. Motion passed.

<u>Picnic recap</u>: HOT! Not as well attended 30 of congregation and 8-10 community members. Plenty of side dishes were donated, which was very heartening. It went well and great job to everyone who donated food and pitched in to help.

Reminder that the Four Church Farm is September 15<sup>th</sup>. Plates, drinks and meats are provided and those coming are asked to bring a dish to share. If the weather is inclement, the event will be held at St. John's. A map will be in upcoming bulletins. 140<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Celebration October 13<sup>th</sup>. Asking for short (1 minute) videos from congregation members about their history with St. Paul's. Other suggestions are welcomed. Picnic will be held indoors or outdoors depending on weather. We will make sure to invite the Rauch's, Jim Williams & Margaret Marx. Kerrill will email histories to Pastor and Jerry Y.

<u>Pastor's Report:</u> – a pretty slow month. Library refresh complete. Fiddling with a/c in office. Once the humidity issue is fixed he is planning on an office refresh to remove mildewy smell and unnecessary stuff. Hopes to start a new catechism class in the fall. Motion to approve report made by Mary B seconded by John G & passed.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u>: Income exceeded budgeted amount. Deficit stands at \$37,464.04 – 56% of projected amount. All reports balance. Two adjusting entries made to move

expenses to appropriate accounts. Non-audit audit completed by Sally Finck with no findings. Discussion regarding deficit in Altar Flowers Fund of \$2300. Motion made to begin using silk flowers January 2025. If members want to donate real flowers in 2025, they can have arrangement provided by a florist. Greta will reach out to The Climbing Rose and terminate our agreement effective January 1, 2025. Greta B made motion, Jerry D seconded. Motion passed.

Motion to approve treasurer's report by Mary B seconded by Sally F. Motion passed. Rental Property: Committee met with Larry from Encore Management on Aug 13<sup>th</sup>. Will be meeting again to finalize decision regarding management company Sept 11<sup>th</sup>. Discussion ensued regarding pros and cons of management firm. While the council did lean in favor of a management company, it was returned to rental property committee for a decision.

<u>Property Committee</u>: Need to replace the toilet between Weisgerber Lounge and Library. Working on getting roof pictures to show congregation. Sally suggested a pledge card for roof funds. Discussion about repairing church sign next to the roundabout. Greta will reach out to get quote on repair and Jim will send Pastor contactor contact information.

Congregation Care: All shut-ins visited.

### Other Business:

- Rumpke will charge \$33.75 per month for four trash carts 105, 107 and two for the church instead of \$85 per month for the 2 yard container we currently have. Half the cost would then be rental expense. Pastor moved, Jerry D seconded to change to the four trash carts. Motion approved. Jim Rengert with contact our rep and make the change.
- Emily Blegvad-Monroe will be taking pictures for the church directory on Sunday September 22, 29 and Saturday September 28<sup>th</sup>. Probably in the chapel.
- Fred Freytag asked for someone to take the lead on the Mecklenburg 2025 Visit Committee. Kerrill volunteered and will ask Fred to prepare a note for the bulletin regarding reassembling a committee.
- Sunday School for kids will start in October. Sally will reach out to Juli to coordinate youth choir with Sunday school.


