

Well, we did it; we survived another campaign cycle. The choices are made and now we move on. Some are disappointed or angry because their candidate, in whom they had invested their hopes for the future and their sense of identity as an American, was defeated. Others are elated because they won. But win or lose, we have made our choice and now must live with those choices. And talk about those choices, which no doubt we will over the holidays, perhaps to the detriment of family unity. Who will get the slap on the back? Who will get the slap upside the head? Who will get the silent treatment, and who will have their ear talked off?

No matter how we voted or how we feel about this or that issue, we now have to live with it – and with each other. We have chosen new leaders, but the underlying conflicts that rose to the surface during the campaign remain. We are a deeply divided nation and our new leaders will have to figure out how to lead not just their party, but the entire nation. At least I hope they will, because in the end it isn't about winning or losing; it is about leading, and it is hard to be a good leader when only half the people follow.

If we will claim to be a "Christian" nation, then it is my prayer that our leaders will fall back on those foundational principals that have defined Christianity since the beginning: hope, inclusion, compassion, grace, forgiveness, and self-sacrifice. These are what made Jesus the Good Shepherd and they are still the standard for a good leader today. And, by the way, are pretty helpful traits for the sheep as well.

May God bless us as we start this new journey together, and may God bless our new leaders with "the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the

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spirit of counsel and might, the spirit of knowledge and the fear of the Lord."

Things to note about the 2025 Budget:

The pastor's salary reflects a 4%% increase as mandated by the synod. This has been apportioned between the base salary and housing allowance. Medical costs have increased slightly. The church provides continuing spousal health care, 12% pension, as well as disability and life insurance. The allowance amount has remained constant.

Staff Salaries - The church secretary shows an increase from \$11.75 to \$12 per hour. Organist increases to \$16,500 and the Choir director to \$9,000. Hourly increases have been budgeted for the sextons from \$15 per hour to \$15.50 per hour.

Church Facilities has been adjusted to \$41,500 to reflect increasing facility and insurance costs.

Please also note that I have not included a Mecklenburg budget as \$5000 was already approved in a prior year (2020 - plague time) for a visit, so while this will be an expense, monies for it have already been approved and set aside.

Income Based on the last few recent months, offerings were calculated at \$13,000 a month. Interest income not adjusted due to market volatility. Rental property return was left at \$20,000 to be conservative.

The expected deficit is \$ 79.958. In 2025 we will need to use savings to cover the deficit amount should it be as large as calculated. This was discussed when we prepared to call a full-time pastor, so the deficit is not unexpected, but cannot continue indefinitely.

There will be a brief meeting after church on Sunday December 1st and Saturday December 7th for anyone who has questions regarding the 2025 budget.
